Make sure that your files are supplied at the correct size for your booking, including adding bleed and crop marks and ensuring fonts are embedded or outlined. No spot colours can be used. No responsibility can be taken for incorrectly supplied files. We cannot accept Word, Powerpoint, Publisher, Canva or QuarkXpress files as final artwork.

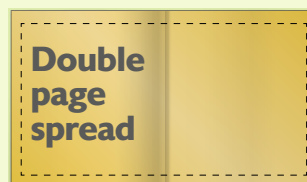

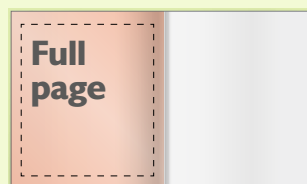

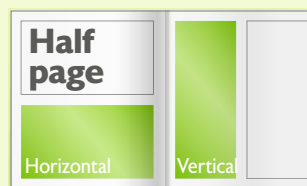
Trim size

1/8" bleed on all edges if using the trim size

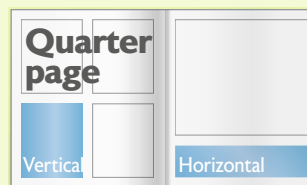
Safe area
